## RESOLUTION NO. 16-15

### AUTHORIZING APPLYING FOR TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TAP) GRANT FUNDS

**WHEREAS**, The Peoria-Pekin Urbanized Area Transportation Study (PPUATS) is soliciting applications for a Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funded program known as the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) to enhance transportation alternatives, and

**WHEREAS**, The TAP program has identified transit infrastructure improvement projects that achieve compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and projects that improve non-motorized transportation user safety and efficiency, and

**WHEREAS**, CityLink recently removed nearly 75 bus benches to address ADA handicapped access regulations, and

**WHEREAS**, Many of the former CityLink bus bench locations will be replaced by solar powered lighted shelters or will need preliminary engineering to design and construct concrete pads in locations with appropriate handicapped access, and

**WHEREAS**, the TAP grant program requires a local share ranging from 20% to 50%, and

**WHEREAS**, non-federal CityLink funds are available to meet local share requirements and CityLink staff have the experience and ability to oversee the completion of an accelerated bus bench and bus shelter replacement program including the contracting for professional preliminary engineering services,

#### **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

The Board of Trustees of the Greater Peoria Mass Transit District hereby authorizes the General Manager to apply for TAP grant funding in both the 2015 and 2016 cycle seeking combined two year awards of up to \$362,987.


